

# Evelyn Clark Designs . . .

## Madrona Lace Scarf

*This rectangular scarf was designed to celebrate both Madrona Fiber Arts 15th Anniversary Retreat in 2014 and the tree for which the conference is named.*

*Like the Madronas native to the Pacific Northwest, this scarf has leaves and berries. It is knit from end to end, and the asymmetrical patterning includes a 10-stitch leaf repeat to customize the width. An option is given to add beads between the motifs and at the symmetrically scalloped ends.*

*This design looks great in a variety of handspun and commercial lace, fingering, and Shetland/sport/DK weight yarns.*

### Abbreviations

k	knit
k2tog	knit 2 stitches together
k3tog	knit 3 stitches together
p	purl
RS	right side of scarf
sk2p	slip 1 stitch knitwise, k2tog, and pass slipped stitch over k2tog
ssk	slip 1 stitch knitwise, slip next stitch knitwise, replace on holding needle, and k2tog through back loops
st(s)	stitch(es)
WS	wrong side of scarf
yo	yarn over
*	repeat instructions between asterisks
()	repeat instructions inside parentheses
[]	repeat instructions inside brackets

### Yarn

Approximately 300–500 yds (275–460 m) lace, fingering, or Shetland/sport/DK weight yarns.

### Needles & Gauge

Individual knitting style and yarn characteristics affect the lace, so choose a needle size that gives preferred results by knitting a swatch in stockinette stitch.



### Sample Scarf

65 g (300 yds/275 m) Malabrigo Sock Color 855 Aguas fingering weight (17 wpi) yarn on US size 3 (3.25 mm) needles with 208 size 6 beads and size 12 (1 mm) crochet hook. Stockinette stitch gauge: 24 sts = 4" (10 cm). Scarf measures 8 x 54" (20.5 x 137 cm).

### Supplies

2 stitch markers; tapestry needle to weave in ends; and rustproof pins for blocking

### Optional Supplies

Beads and crochet hook that will fit through bead hole; and blocking wires

# Instructions

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## Scarf Notes

1. Scarf starts on a multiple of 10 plus 25 stitches. It can be made wider or narrower by adding or subtracting 10-stitch leaf repeats.
2. It is helpful to place markers after the beginning and before the ending 2-stitch borders.
3. The first stitch of every row is slipped purlwise with yarn at front to create a chained edge.
4. An option is included to bead the ends and stitches between the motifs. To bead a stitch, k1, pull that stitch through the bead hole with a crochet hook, and replace on needle. If no beads are desired, work the bead stitch as a knit stitch.
5. The ending border can be started after any 20-row Madrona Lace Repeat.
6. Patterning is different at each end to create symmetrical scallops.
7. Lace can be worked from written instructions or charts.
8. Wraps-per-inch (wpi) is a way to measure yarn size. Without stretching, wrap yarn around a ruler for 1" (2.5 cm), and count the strands.

## INSTRUCTIONS

**Cast-on** (See Note 1 above.)

Loosely cast on 45 sts.

Start Beginning Border.

### Beginning Border (Chart 1)

See Note 4 above about beading a stitch.

Row 1 (RS): sl1, k1, place marker, k4, bead 3 sts, [k7, bead 3 sts] to last 6 sts, k4, place marker, k2.

Row 2 (WS): sl1, knit across.

Start Madrona Lace Beginning.

### Madrona Lace Beginning (Chart 2)

Instructions inside brackets are repeated across to specified remaining number of stitches.

Row 1 (RS): sl1, k2, yo, k2, ssk, p1, k2tog, k2, [yo, k1, yo, k2, ssk, p1, k2tog, k2] to last 3 sts, yo, k3.

All Even Rows (WS): sl1, k1, purl to last 2 sts, k2.

Row 3: sl1, [k3, yo, k1, ssk, p1, k2tog, k1, yo] to last 4 sts, k4.

Row 5: sl1, k4, yo, ssk, p1, k2tog, yo, k1, k2tog, yo, k2, yo, ssk, p1, k2tog, yo, k1, [k4, yo, ssk, p1, k2tog, yo, k1] to last 4 sts, k4.

Row 7: sl1, k5, yo, sk2p, yo, k1, (k2tog, yo) 2 times, k2, yo, sk2p, yo, k2, [k5, yo, sk2p, yo, k2] to last 4 sts, k4.

Row 9: sl1, k1, p1, k2tog, k2, yo, bead 1 st, yo, k3tog, (yo, k2tog) 3 times, yo, bead 1 st, yo, k2, [ssk, p1, k2tog, k2, yo, bead 1 st, yo, k2] to last 5 sts, ssk, p1, k2.

Row 11: sl1, k1, p1, k2tog, k2, yo, k1, yo, ssk, (k2tog, yo) 2 times, k1, k2tog, yo, k1, yo, k2, [ssk, p1, k2tog, k2, yo, k1, yo, k2] to last 5 sts, ssk, p1, k2.

Row 13: sl1, k1, p1, k2tog, k1, yo, k3, yo, ssk, k2tog, yo, k1, k2tog, yo, k3, yo, k1, [ssk, p1, k2tog, k1, yo, k3, yo, k1] to last 5 sts, ssk, p1, k2.

Start Madrona Lace Repeat.

### Madrona Lace Repeat (Chart 3)

Row 1 (RS): sl1, k1, p1, k2tog, yo, k5, yo, ssk, k1, k2tog, yo, k1, k2tog, yo, k2, yo, [ssk, p1, k2tog, yo, k5, yo] to last 5 sts, ssk, p1, k2.

All Even Rows (WS): sl1, k1, purl to last 2 sts, k2.

Row 3: sl1, k1, k2tog, yo, k7, yo, sk2p, yo, k1, (k2tog, yo) 2 times, k2, [yo, sk2p, yo, k7] to last 4 sts, yo, ssk, k2.

Row 5: sl1, k1, bead 1 st, yo, k2, ssk, p1, k2tog, k2, yo, bead 1 st, yo, k3tog, (yo, k2tog) 3 times, [yo, bead 1 st, yo, k2, ssk, p1, k2tog, k2] to last 3 sts, yo, bead 1 st, k2.

Row 7: sl1, k2, yo, k2, ssk, p1, k2tog, k2, yo, k1, yo, ssk, (k2tog, yo) 2 times, k1, k2tog, [yo, k1, yo, k2, ssk, p1, k2tog, k2] to last 3 sts, yo, k3.

Row 9: sl1, k3, yo, k1, ssk, p1, k2tog, k1, yo, k3, yo, ssk, k2tog, yo, k1, k2tog, yo, [k3, yo, k1, ssk, p1, k2tog, k1, yo] to last 4 sts, k4.

Row 11: sl1, k4, yo, ssk, p1, k2tog, yo, k1, k2tog, yo, k2, yo, ssk, k1, k2tog, yo, k1, [k4, yo, ssk, p1, k2tog, yo, k1] to last 4 sts, k4.

Row 13: sl1, k5, yo, sk2p, yo, k1, (k2tog, yo) 2 times, k2, yo, sk2p, yo, k2, [k5, yo, sk2p, yo, k2] to last 4 sts, k4.

Row 15: sl1, k1, p1, k2tog, k2, yo, bead 1 st, yo, k3tog, (yo, k2tog) 3 times, yo, bead 1 st, yo, k2, [ssk, p1, k2tog, k2, yo, bead 1 st, yo, k2] to last 5 sts, ssk, p1, k2.

Row 17: sl1, k1, p1, k2tog, k2, yo, k1, yo, ssk, (k2tog, yo) 2 times, k1, k2tog, yo, k1, yo, k2, [ssk, p1, k2tog, k2, yo, k1, yo, k2] to last 5 sts, ssk, p1, k2.

Row 19: sl1, k1, p1, k2tog, k1, yo, k3, yo, ssk, k2tog, yo, k1, k2tog, yo, k3, yo, k1, [ssk, p1, k2tog, k1, yo, k3, yo, k1] to last 5 sts, ssk, p1, k2.

# Instructions

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Work Rows 1–20 to desired length. (For sample, repeat was worked 20 times.)

Start Madrona Lace Ending Border.

## **Madrona Lace Ending Border (Chart 4)**

Row 1 (RS): sl1, k1, p1, k2tog, yo, k5, yo, ssk, k1, k2tog, yo, k5, yo, [ssk, p1, k2tog, yo, k5, yo] to last 5 sts, ssk, p1, k2.

Row 2 (WS): sl1, k1, purl to last 2 sts, k2.

Row 3: sl1, k1, k2tog, yo, k7, [yo, sk2p, yo, k7] to last 4 sts, yo, ssk, k2.

Row 4: sl1, knit across.

Row 5: sl1, [k5, bead 3 sts, k2] to last 4 sts, k4.

Row 6 (WS): work Elastic Cast-off.

## **Elastic Cast-off**

k1, \*k1, replace 2 sts on holding needle, and k2tog through back loops, repeating from \* across.

## **Finishing**

Weave in yarn ends, and trim after blocking.

## **Blocking**

Soak scarf in water—adding soap appropriate for fiber if desired. Rinse, and wrap in towel to blot. Lay flat, and smooth into shape. If using blocking wires, run through 1 strand of slipped stitches along sides, entering each from the same direction, and pin. Pull out and pin edge scallops below 3 beaded stitches at the beginning and above 3 beaded stitches at the end. Leave in place until thoroughly dry. Trim yarn ends.

## Notes

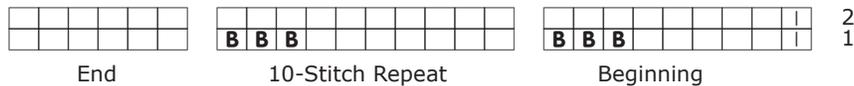
1. See written instructions for cast-on and cast-off information.
2. Read charts from bottom to top and from right to left.
3. On Charts 1 and 4, all rows are charted. On Charts 2 and 3, only odd rows are charted; all even rows: sl1, k1, purl to last 2 sts, k2.

## Symbols and Abbreviations Key

	bead	knit 1 stitch and place bead over it with a crochet hook
	k	knit
	k2tog	knit 2 stitches together
	k3tog	knit 3 stitches together
	sk2p	slip 1 stitch knitwise, knit next 2 stitches together, and pass slipped stitch over k2tog
	p	purl
	ssk	slip 1 stitch knitwise, slip next stitch knitwise, replace on holding needle, and k2tog through back loops
	yo	yarn over

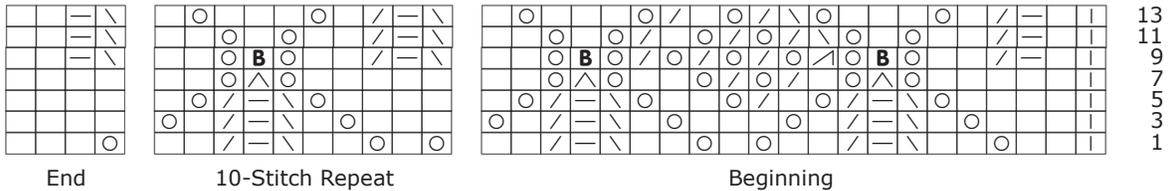

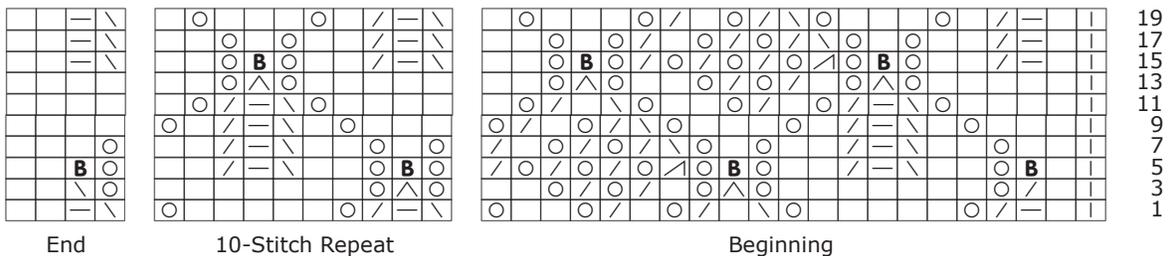

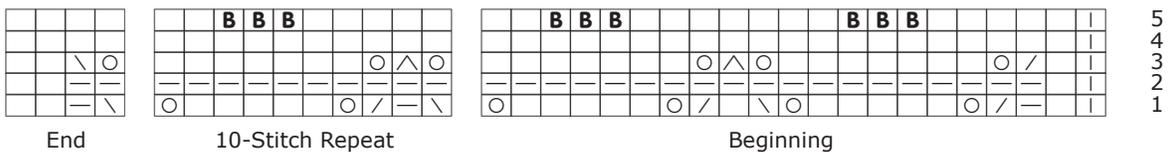
